## Just a thought ...

I was at the hospital recently, when I heard a voice say "Hello, Susan". I glanced round to see who had spoken, and if they were speaking to me, and then looked at the person who was checking everyone as they came in. I looked again, and she could tell I didn't know whether she had spoken to me, so she said "Hello, it's KM". Immediately, I recognised her! We had been at Sunday School together many years ago, and our paths had crossed very occasionally since then. I laughed, and we greeted each other before I went on to my appointment.

Thinking about our meeting when I got home, though, I began to understand more clearly something that we all think about at this time of year, but may have puzzled about. Why did people not recognise Jesus on Easter Sunday, and in the days that followed? It isn't made clear by Jesus, although He *does* say to Mary Magdalen *Do not hold on to me*. It has been suggested that that could mean literally, or that she should let Him go from the way that she knew Him, because He was now different; He had resurrected, *the first fruits of the dead*, and He had taken on the new, incorruptible body that is promised to us all for eternity. The disciples, although frightened and unsure when He appeared in the Upper Room, had at least had word from Mary and the other women that He was alive.

But what about Cleopas and his wife, on the road to Emmaus that same evening? In the Upper Room, Jesus used his normal greeting to His disciples *Peace be with you.* For Cleopas and his companion, they had no idea who they were with until Jesus *took bread and broke it,* and then vanished from their sight. On other occasions the disciples and other followers did not recognise Him when He appeared to them, until He acted or spoke in ways that had been familiar to them. None of them were expecting ever to see Him again, so when they did, it was as though they had never met him. And after my experience at the hospital, I can understand that! K had to identify herself by name, before my brain rewired and I could recognise who she was.

In our everyday life, do we expect to see Jesus? Are we ready to recognise Him? Or is it so long since we have encountered Him that He would need to speak, or do something, to remind us who He is?
